The following requirements listed for each merit badge are accompanied by specific information indicating our requirements for how the prerequisite should be completed. There will be no exceptions to this policy. These requirements must be completed prior to coming to camp and turned in to the counselor no later than Monday s merit badge class:

Art: 4 –Note from the Scoutmaster

Astronomy: 6 –Bring finished sketches to camp.

Bugling: 6 Note from the Scoutmaster.

Camping: 9A, 9B, 9C –Note from the Scoutmaster.

Citizenship (Nation): 2 Bring written reports to camp;

3 Bring newspaper clippings; 8 Bring letter and any response.

Citizenship (World): 1, 2 Bring written answers to camp;

7 Provide appropriate documentation

Cooking: 3 7– Appropriate documentation and note from Scoutmaster required.

Emergency Preparedness: 1 Note from Scoutmaster;

2Band 2C Bring chart and note from parents/guardians;

7 Provide appropriate documentation; 8C Bring family emergency kit to camp.

Energy: 4 Bring report to camp.

Environmental Science: 3E –Bring report to camp.

Farm Mechanics: 5-Bring Report to Camp

Fire Safety: 6A, 11 Bring Reports to Camp.

First Aid: 1 Note from Scoutmaster; 2B Bring kit to camp.

Fish and Wildlife Management: 7A, 7B, 7C or 7D Bring reports to camp (7A, 7B, 7C) or provide appropriate documentation for / photos from your aquarium (7D).

Insect Study: 3, 7 Provide appropriate documentation.

Lifesaving: 1A Note from Scoutmaster.

Nature: 4A2 Provide appropriate documentation (photos and report).

Plant Science: 4, Provide documentation of plant growth.

7 Option 1 #5, OR Option 2 #5, OR Option 3 #6 Bring reports and appropriate documentation to camp.

Personal Fitness: 1B-Bring Documentation

6,7,8-Show Documentation

Reptile and Amphibian Study: 8A or 8B Provide appropriate documentation.

Swimming: 3 Note from the Scoutmaster.

Weather: 8A Bring instrument and log to camp.

Wilderness Survival: 5 Bring to camp.

P.O.W.E.R.: Energy- 4 Bring report to Camp;

Appropriate Documentation may be a report, photo documentation, etc. or a combination of these elements. Be thorough! Use whatever means necessary to show your counselor what you did to complete the requirement(s).

Bring to Camp items are generally judged on the reasonability standard. For example, we don t expect unwieldy items like multiple gallons of water to be brought to camp (as in the Emergency Preparedness prerequisites), but we do expect a quality effort on behalf of the Scouts. For example, for the home first aid kit required for First Aid merit badge, we do not require splints, breathing masks or other large expensive items, but we do expect more than band-aids and gauze. Again, be thorough! Go the extra mile.

Note from the Scoutmaster is just that a-signed slip of paper indicating the specific requirements completed by the Scout before the start of camp.

There will be no exceptions to the prerequisites!

**Scouts are responsible to know the merit badge requirements!**

Items NOT permitted at camp:

Fireworks, aerosol sprays of any kind, liquid fuel or propane, tobacco, firearms, bows, straight-blade sheath knives, heaters and electronics such as cell phones, Game boys/PSP, Radios, CD or MP3 players. These items if found will be confiscated.

Scout Uniform- Required for travel and ceremonies

Complete Uniform:

- .. Official Scout Shirt
  - .. Official Scout Socks
  - .. Official Scout Belt (2 pair min)
  - .. Troop Scarf (can be Philmont)
  - .. Troop Slide
  - .. Official Scout Pants/Shorts
  - .. Boots
  - .. Activity Troop t-shirts
- (2 recommended. Scouts will be wearing these at specific events)
- .. Loose fitting long pants with pockets (No sweat pants) and loose fitting long sleeve shirt required for a ceremony.
  - .. *Your* Pipestone - if you earned it last year
  - .. Pipestone Wood - 1 cubic foot – No bark, 12" Long, 3/8"-1" DIA- Bundled & securely tied and tagged with your name.
  - .. Money for Merit Badges - See next page
  - .. Merit Badge Cards filled out
  - .. Merit badge Prerequisites-See next page
  - .. Clothing for cool weather - Layers are best! (Hoody sweatshirt and windbreaker, or light jacket)
  - .. Warm Pajamas or Sweat suit to sleep in. (Prepare for cool evenings! We have had 40 degree nights!)
  - .. Underwear - enough for 6 days
  - .. Casual shorts

- .. Casual shirts (no logos or appropriate for scouting)
- .. Socks - 6-7 pairs minimum
- .. Extra pair of shoes in case one gets wet.
- .. Rain Coat or poncho
- .. Swimsuit and Towel
- .. Bug Repellant (non-Aerosol)
- .. Sunscreen
- .. Flashlight and extra batteries
- .. Drinking cup and Water bottle
- .. Towel for showering (different towel than for swimming)
- .. Water shoes or sandals to wear in shower.
- .. Book bag to carry items during the day
- .. Watch/Alarm Clock -You will be responsible to be on time!
- .. 2 Pencils or pens and a Spiral notebook.
- .. 3 -foot piece of rope with whipped ends -
- .. Hanger
- .. Plastic bag or sack for dirty laundry
- .. Sleeping Bag or Blankets (be prepared for 40 degree nights!)
- .. Pillow (optional)
- .. Foam Ground Pad and Ground Cloth (Heavy plastic sheet)
- .. Backpack or duffle bag -We will be carrying personal equipment from parking lot to campsite about -1/2 ml
